Story Sergeant Clark was amongst the fifty who formed the first draft of the Vancouver Artillery. He came to England in July 1915 and crossed to France in January 1916 with the 22nd Battery (6th Howitzer Brigade). He remained with his Battery through all the fighting till March 1918, when, during the German Advance, his gun was struck by a shell and he and two of his gunners were killed.

Story Lieutenant Crighton served for four years with the 4th (TF) Black Watch, attaining the rank of sergeant, and when a student at University Collge, Dundee, was a member of the Officers' training Corps. He also took a deep interest in the Boys' Brigade and gave devoted service as an officer in the 10th (Wallacetown Parish Church) Company, which has commemorated his service by a tablet in the church. Gazetted in September 1914, he was promoted in January 1915. Latterly he held the very responsible post of bombing officer for the 44th Infantry Brigade.
