Story William Wallace enlisted in the Highland Cyclist Battalion in December 1914 when under 17 years of age. When 18 years of age he volunteered for service in France and was transferred to the HLI. He was wounded in March 1917 and invalided home. He returned to Frane early in 1918. William was the second of four brothers serving in the Army to fall. Davis, one of the two who survived, was also an "old boy".
